Woman Eternal is an organization that aims to improve accessibility of maternal health services to vulnerable pregnant women and newborns in Kenya, living below the poverty line, while facing daily challenges such as, lack of safe and secure living environments, socioeconomic barriers, poverty, and other underlying issues.

We are a non-for-profit organization, fully donor supported.

Since 2020, we have seen our pre- and postnatal outreach program in Kenya continue to be in high demand. Our drop-in center continues to receive daily referrals.

Our local community outreach program LEA MAMA, which is Swahili for Care for Mums, provides out of hospital welfare support, as well as distributing mum and baby maternity packages.

We are forever grateful to our donors, fundraisers, and volunteers both in Kenya and Australia. Thank you for enabling us to have a far and impactful reach.

Although we have set the above as our broad priority targets, there are however, other emerging concerns that are also addressed within our outreach program.

- Our Drop-in-center
   offers meals, and in
   some cases, women

- We network with the local public hospital, which runs nutrition information sessions for the women in our program to attend.



Majority of the vulnerable women accessing our program need encouragement and support to attend maternal health clinic appointments.



We are able to purchase the necessary government issued hospital cards for women accessing our pre/post-natal program.

- National Health Insurance Fund (NHIF) card and,
- Linda Mama Card which is issued to pregnant women to enable them access maternity clinics.
- The outreach team also accompany the women to clinic appointments as part of welfare support.



These are important aspects of our journey. It's a two-fold approach.

1). Women who have previously benefited from our program receive mentoring to enable them to re-join as helpers.

2). Employment opportunities for other women from the local community to work as part of the outreach team.

Lea Mama Drop-in-Center

Women in our program utilize the shower facility prior to their hospital appointments and also have a rest in the bedroom at the center.


The drop-in-center is a safe space where the women meet and encourage one another while sharing a meal.

We also offer information sessions at the center whenever possible.

Our community outreach team were able to support women accessing the Drop-in-center.



#### **Donor support**

Funds raised were utilized directly in Kenya to support Lea Mama program, with the following expenses being funded.

- Allowances for the community outreach team
- Transport costs for home and hospital visits
- Rent and bills for the Lea Mama Drop- In- Centre.
- Registration of Woman Eternal in Kenya
- Mum and baby postnatal hampers
- Meals provided at the center
- Medical expenses (on an ad hoc basis)
